
Key action areas for greater food systems resilience

The pandemic offers an opportunity to transform food systems

- Good ideas are plentiful
 - Expand the flexibility of social protection programs
 - Increase access to financial services for the poor
 - Digitize financial services and agricultural value chain operations
- Conventional priorities still matter
 - Protect competitive markets and international trade
 - Invest in rural infrastructure, education, extension, and research
- Radical shifts remain challenging
 - Move from "food staple fundamentalism" to nature-positive, gender-transformative, and nutritionally sensitive agriculture
